GUEST PRESENTATION: Keoni Alvarez, independent film producer, director, and author, Keoni Alvarez Productions	<p>Keoni Alvarez shared his experience of the long journey to protect his ancestors' burial cave in Waikahekahe iki (Ainaloa subdivision). His efforts were documented in the film "Kapu: Sacred Hawaiian Burials," a passion project that took twenty years. The film has been internationally successful, bringing worldwide attention to the importance of protecting iwi kupuna in Hawai'i.</p> <p>Keoni told the group that his work continues, with burial caves throughout the islands threatened by development. He asked each member to introduce ourselves, our relation to the mission of the cultural preservation committee, how he could be of help to our group and how we might be able to help him with his efforts. The responses were varied, but the common thread was our respect for and understanding of the importance of the `aina. We agreed that we could aid each other in spreading that message and encouraging respect for the entire area and not just burial sites, because the Hawaiians come from the land and are a part of the land. He encouraged us to share the link to his film (on his website keonialvarez.com) with friends and family.</p>	For information.
